


Eilert Janssen Auen

When Eilert Janssen Auen was born on April 30, 1837, in Beschotenweg, Ostfriesland, Hanover, his father, Jan, was 33 and his mother, Peetje, was 29. He married Jantje Meinen De Buhr on October 12, 1860, in Hatshausen, Ostfriesland. They had seven children together in 16 years, Jantje had 2 sons from a previous marriage as well. He died on September 23, 1909, in Sac, Iowa, at the age of 72.




Ostfriesland

Eilert was born 30 April 1837, in Beschotenweg, East Friesland, This was part of Hanover at the time. He was a sailor prior to immigrating as were many from that region, on the North Sea in Germany.

The family, Eilert and Jantje and the five older children, first settled in Grundy County near Ackley, lowa after immigrating in 1868.

Following is the information I found or could discover on Eilert and Jantje Auen:

Eilert and Jantje Auen; joined the Wheatland Presbyterian Church on January 28, 4877. They were very early members (the church was formed in 1876) numbers 14 & 15 on the membership roll. They were dismissed to the Emmanuel Presbyterian Church in Cernaryon, Iowa (7 miles north of here) on October 22, 1905. I consulted with Don Gibson, the pastor of that congregation, but could find no further information; many of the church records for most congregations before the turn of the century are very poor. They were received into the Carmaryon Congregation on March 11, 1906.

The headstone in the Wheatland Cemetery stated that Jantje's maiden name was DeBur. E Reading through our Centennial Book I found that Eilert Auen cause from the vicinity of Ackley, Iowa. There are 5 presbyterian churches there: East Priceland, R.R. 2, 50601, West Friesland, E.R. 1, 50601, and First Pres. 1st Ave. 6 State St., 50601. All of our mix early members were East Friesland (Outfreem) in German) so I would presume that East Friesland Church would be your best bet. Also, since the first party of East Friesland to come to this country settled in German Valley, Stephenson County, Illinois, most subsequent groups also went there before dispersing across the midwest, so you might check there for further information also. I believe it is a Reformed congregation there, but I am not sure. I believe it is a selection compared to the am not sure.

I do not know where they died, they are buried here at Mheatland. I would presume that they transferred to the Carmarvon church because it was closer to their home. So, I would assume that they were living either in the rural area near Carmarvon or Lake View or in Lake View. That is Sac County, Iowa.

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June 7, 1880

On June 7, 1880, Eilert Auen lived in Wheatland, Iowa. He owned 200 acres and had 6 horses, 11 milk cows, 14 pigs, and 29 poultry. He grew wheat, Indian corn, hay, barley, oats and potatoes. The farm produced 1000 lbs of butter and 150 dozen eggs in 1879.


In 1885, Eilert Auen was 48 years old and lived in Carroll, Iowa. He was a farmer.



In the death of Eilert Auen, Sr., at Carnaryon, Iowa, Carroll county loses one of its earliest settlers. Mr. Auen had been ailing for several months from a complication of diseases, dying at his home in Carnaryon Friday evening, September 23th, surrounded by his immediate family. Eilert Auen was born in Freeseland, Germany, May 5th, 1835, and spent his early manhood as a sailor. In 1868 he came to America, settling near Ackley, 7.5 Butler county, where he remained for five years when he again moved farther west, aldcating on a farm in Wheatland township, Carroll county, where he lived until his retirement to Arcadia in 1806. A couple of years ago his sons started in business in Carnarvon and Mr. Auen moved his family there. Ellert Auen was a most entertaining companion and always had a lot of funny and interesting stories to talk of which endeared him to all of his acquaintances. He leaves with his aged wife to mourn his loss four sons, Henry, John, Eilert Jr., and George, three daughters, Mrs. Greves, of Ashton, Iowa, Mrs. H. F. Garrells of Lake View, Iowa, and Mrs. A. A. Kelley of Arcadia. besides one brother, Henry of Carnarvon. The funeral from Carnaryon on Monday was largely attended, the remains being laid to rest in the Presbyterian cemetery in Wheatland township, the congregation of which Mr. Auen was a staunch supporter.-West Side Journal.

He was born in Beschotenweg, district Weener, East Friesland on the 3rd of May 1835 and died on the 24th of Sept. 1909. He reached the age of 74 years, 4 months and 21 days. In 1859 he married Jantje De Buhr, who mourns his death with seven children and their families as well as one brother. Three children died previously. In the year 1868, Eilert Auen came to America with his family, where they spent the first five years in Butler, Co Iowa. In 1873, they came to Carroll Co., lowa and were living here since that time. Eilert Auen used to be very strong (powerful) but he suffered much in his last years and the last 14 weeks he was a very ill man but death released him from all his suffering. The grieving widow Jantje Auen, nee De Buhr and children and grandchildren. Carnarvon, Sac County, Iowa Carnarvon, Iowa. On the 24th of Sept., the old father and grandfather, Eilert Auen died here after 14 weeks of sickness. He was one of the first settlers in this area as he came to Carroll County in the year 1873.
